Nursing Officer definition

Nursing Officers provide primary and tertiary patient care to ill and injured Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members, either in Canadian Forces Health Services Centers in Canada, or in acute care hospitals while on operations abroad. Nursing Officers also provide preventive, occupational and environmental health care services through practice as well as through health education and policy development. Nursing Officers work within a collaborative practice model with other members of the health care team.

Nursing Officers have the opportunity to work in different domains of nursing practice including:

- Clinical/patient care delivery;

- Health services policy development;
- Administration; and
- Training and education.
- Emergency
- Air forces
- Other army sectors

If nurses already have a university degree and license to practice as a registered Nurse in a Canadian province or territory, the CAF may place you directly into an on-the-job training program following basic training.
