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Aims and Objectives

Course Aim:

- To provide students with foundational knowledge and skills in responsible professional behavior.
- It involves teaching of fundamental knowledge and skills in ethical theory and reasoning, professional ethics, interprofessional approach to health care decision-making, goals of health care, and other topics of concern.



Medical Ethics

- Ethics deals with the right choices of conduct considering all the circumstances. It deals with the distinction between what is considered right or wrong at a given time in a given culture.
- Medical ethics is concerned with the obligations of the doctors and the hospital to the patient along with other health professionals and society.

-Professionalism

■ A set of values, behaviours, and relationships that underpins the trust the public has in healthcare profession.
