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Why military nursing job is dangerous:

1.it is stressful 2. heartbreaking job. 3. Working in foreign war zones 4. working in near or inside war places. 5.dealing with wounded soldiers.

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Roles and Responsibilities of military nurses:

- 1. Provide treatment of wounded soldiers and other military personnel
- 2. Set up military programs in war zones, as needed
- 3. Provide emotional support to soldiers and families
- 4. Treat civilians, as needed
- 5. Provide treatment to service members' families.
- 6. Administer vaccines to children
- 7. Provide assistance in any humanitarian relief efforts, as needed
- 8. Assist victims of natural disasters
- 9. Provide update information about war.

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Military nurses' roles in health services:

1.care givers

2. care about healing process of diseases

3.ethical decision makers

4.use critical thinking in her, his work

.5. collaboration with colleagues and family about care of patients and clients.

6.clincal advocate

7.safe environment

8.case managers

9.protect patient from any allergic or reaction of drugs

10.protect legal and human rights.

11.prevention and give immunization during pandemic or epidemic diseases,

12.protect clients or patient's religion or cultures.

13.delegates with other health workers or nursing team about any interventions.

15.she provides comfort for patient to decrease anxiety and sadness.

Requirements for certification and license in nursing and military nursing:

1.For diploma needs two years from start to finish and includes clinical rotations and examination.

2.For bachelor's degree in nursing needs four-year programs in-depth learning and additional clinical experiences. A BSN degree makes you more attractive to potential employers and may give you access to additional job options, such as teaching, leadership roles, research and consulting.

3. After you have some nursing experience, you may choose to go on for a master's degree to become a clinical nurse specialist. This route is particularly helpful if you want to be involved in research. Or go to PhD degree and engaging research issues in two of them

4.To obtain the license to practice your clinical competence you should pass examination and achieve all requirements as to pass the National Council Licensure Examination. Some states may have other required certifications or qualifications. Criminal background checks may be required.

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Job Growth Trend in nursing :

Healthcare services of all types continue to experience growth, partially because of an increase in the aging population that has more health issues to treat. Because of this greater demand for care, the nursing field has a projected growth of 15 percent between 2016 and 2026. That's a much faster growth rate than general job growth. Between the increased need for nurses and the retirement of current nurses, there will be many positions available. However, more people are going to nursing school, so there is some competition for the best positions.
